Susan Ploughe Getting Started in Gouache Friday, February 28, 2025 9:00am-4:00pm

The Studio will be open at 8:30am. We start promptly at 9am, so get there early enough to set-up.

SUPPLY LIST

Paints



- Winsor & Newton Gouache Set of 10 (assorted colors, 12ml tubes) if you already own tubes of gouache, make sure it is traditional gouache, not acrylic gouache. Have at least a yellow, a red, and a blue so you can mix every hue. You will need a larger tube of white (see next item).
- Winsor & Newton Designer Gouache Permanent White, 37 ml tube - even though there is a tube of white in the set, you will need this.

Brushes

Flats sizes 2, 4, 8 and a smallish pointy round - NOT watercolor brushes; they are too soft. Choose synthetic brushes that have some springiness to them. Mainstreet carries ProWhite, Silverbrush, or Grey Matters brushes. You don't need those exact brushes; check what you already own to see if you have something similar. We are working pretty small, so your biggest brush doesn't need to be any wider than 3/4"

Surfaces

 Susan will bring surfaces. There will be a small fee, around \$10, payable in cash to Susan at the workshop. We will let you know the exact amount soon.



Other Supplies



- Masterson Sta-Wet Handy Palette 8.5"x7" this palette comes with a sponge and special paper palette. It is designed to stay moist and be (relatively) airtight so paints don't dry out, a concern with gouache. Please soak the sponge and one sheet of paper before you come to the workshop, following the detailed instructions that come with the palette. Don't squeeze any paint out ahead of time, though.
- Small Spray Bottle for water. Travel size: should fit in the palm of your hand. Available at many stores.
- Respositionable masking tape No blue painter's tape, and less than 3/4" wide (I use White Artist Tape).
- 2 containers for water. Small things like cream cheese containers or butter tubs are great
- Paper Towels nice absorbent ones
- Pencil and Eraser
