## **SUPPLY LIST for Pastel Artists**

**Pastels -** Bring what you normally work with. Make sure you have a good range of various hues, ranging from lightest to darkest darks. I advocate working with a modest selection of pastels, not every color ever made. <u>Do</u> make sure you have a nice selection of colorful darks, however, so that you aren't stuck using black every time you need to achieve a dark color.

Before the Workshop, I <u>strongly</u> encourage you to organize your pastels by value and hue family. This is Richard McKinley's palette box, as an example.

It is organized horizontally by color (hue): From left to right it's yellow, orange, red, pink, purple, blue, turquoise, and green (and then five columns containing neutral, grayed versions of the colors).

It is organized vertically by value: lightest lights on top moving to darkest darks on the bottom. Even if your pastels are in several different boxes, you can still achieve this.

This is the single most important thing you can do to improve your artwork!





## **Surfaces**

- Pastel Paper
  - o A few large sheets of pastel paper or a number of smaller sheets
  - o Some neutral grey, some white.
  - It doesn't have to be your best paper, but it needs to be able to take a few layers of pastel

## **Tools & Other Items**

- Color Wheel
  - o You can purchase these from Mainstreet.
- Large Board to tape pastel paper to
- Making Tape
  - o Must be neutral color, not blue
- Paper Towels
